



Shipping Ceremony: Master Electric Buses to Paraguay

Taiwan-based e-Bus manufacturer, Master Transportation, has partnered with Paraguay, a diplomatic ally in South America, under the support of the Taiwanese government. The collaboration involves exporting rapid-charging electric buses designed and manufactured in Taiwan (DMIT) to Paraguay. On December 7th, Minister of Foreign Affairs Lin Chia-lung and Paraguayan Ambassador to Taiwan Carlos José Fleitas attended a ceremony at the Port of Taipei to witness the shipment of 30 electric buses manufactured by Master Transportation. The buses will be shipped by sea, transiting through Belgium and Uruguay, and then transported by river, with an expected arrival in Asunción, Paraguay's capital, in February next year. This initiative not only fulfills the Ministry of Foreign Affairs' "Allies Prosperity Plan" but also aligns with President Lai Ching-te's vision of making Taiwan "A Never-Setting Sun Nation in Industries."
